The WongAvery Asia Pacific Peace Museum (APPM) is dedicated to educating and commemorating the history of World War II in Asia (1931-1945). It is a place to witness and remember a forgotten and ignored history, and a space to provoke research and actions for peace and reconciliation.

ALPHA Education offers museum-based learning for secondary students, college and university undergraduates and post graduates, educators, and the public to foster and advance global peace for current and future generations. APPM consists of 10 galleries and a learning space for workshops, pre- or post-visit discussions, and community events.

Program Overview

Educate for Peace is a professional learning opportunity for educators to explore how the museum offers customized learning for secondary students enrolled in different disciplinary or interdisciplinary courses in social sciences and humanities. On a journey from a peace perspective, framing questions guide the museum visit to encourage a reflective understanding of the dynamics of war and peace, and critical inquiry about WWII in Asia and its relevance to contemporary global peace for current and future generations.

The museum visit includes time for professional discussion on learning possibilities for different grades and courses; and on how to select different foci of learning that best meet students learning goals informed by the following thinking concepts:

Historical

Explain the historical significance of WWII in Asia

Legal

Explore connections between values, law, and beliefs

Political

Examine the impact of political engagement on peacebuilding

Economic

Determine the significance of economic policies in wartime

ALPHA Education & APPM welcome all educators whose courses foster the above thinking concepts but not limited to history, law, political science, and economics.
